



Experience Ketchikan's rich maritime history, native culture and breathtaking wilderness surroundings ... by land and by sea.


- Departing your ship by motorcoach, your friendly driver/guide will give lively narrative while pointing out historic Creek Street, where homes and shops are perched over the water on wooden pilings. At Saxman Village, stop to view one of the world's largest gatherings of totem poles. Your guide will interpret the meanings of these giant sentries, which border the park and entrance to the Beaver Clan House.
- Your sightseeing continues to George Inlet, where a relaxing stroll through the rainforest brings you to the historic Libby Cannery. Beginning with a short video, this fascinating tour will take you back to the days when rugged men and women toiled day and night to harvest and process the abundant Alaska salmon. While learning about the adventurous world of fishermen and seine boats you may even have the opportunity to help haul and coil a net!
- From the Cannery Dock you'll board a water-jet powered vessel with heated main cabin, comfortable seating, a snack bar and restroom. While exploring the coastline of glacier-carved George Inlet the onboard naturalist will explain the natural history of Southeast Alaska's forests and ocean. Seals, porpoise, eagles and other species of wildlife are often sighted on this cruise; the captain will maneuver the boat to give the best possible view.
- Entering Tongass Narrows you will pass by a fascinating variety of working vessels. A mariner's view of Alaska's busiest port, and your cruise ship, will provide this tour's final backdrop for learning how Ketchikan earned its title as "Salmon Capital of the World".
- Note: This excursion is not recommended for passengers who have difficulty walking, due to the number of stops requiring embarkation of transfer equipment and walking on inclined pathways. Wildlife sightings are frequent, but not guaranteed. This tour is also conducted in reverse order. Port: Ketchikan, Alaska

Tour Juneau with a naturalist photography guide who will lead you to local "photo hot spots", while sharing tips and techniques to help enhance your images. You will capture Juneau's top sites and abundant marine wildlife on the same excursion! Our itinerary is kept flexible to allow for seasonal highlights and changing light and weather conditions.

The first part of the tour takes place on land, with visits to prime destinations such as the Mendenhall Glacier via our media shuttle. Walk an easy trail through the glacial moraine as you endeavor to get great landscape, nature, and wildlife shots. Next you will board a 32' exploration vessel for an unforgettable journey through the waterways of Juneau's Channel Islands. In this boat we can get close and personal with the environment. It's sheltered from rain and large pontoons provide a steady platform for photographing marine wildlife and shoreline activity.

The star of the show can be different every day: wildflowers in bloom, soaring eagles, spawning salmon, light on a foggy channel, migratory birds, bubble feeding humpback whales, curious sealions, sleek killer whales, and even lumbering black bears are possibilities. Your photo coach will help you take full advantage of the conditions and opportunities of the day.

Learn about Juneau's natural wonders and colorful history as you strive to capture that "decisive moment" in the medium worth a thousand words.



Due to security, no carry-on bags will be allowed on the helicopters. A secure location will be provided at the office for storing personal items.



This tiny outpost sits at the mouth of Slate Creek on the east bank of the Middle Fork of the Koyukuk River, population 13. Overnight in Coldfoot.




